As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic many of the professional development opportunities planned were not able to be implemented. These professional development opportunities mainly involved outside consultants coming to our school sites to support systemic professional development efforts. Professional development efforts supporting learning loss due to the pandemic were instead scheduled and funded with ESSER funds. The carryover funds will be used during the 21-22 school year to again support ongoing professional development efforts focused on conceptual math strategies at the elementary level, ELA strategies including Depth of Knowledge Questioning, Claims and Targets Analysis, and Performance Task Writing at the elementary level, and Professional Learning Community (PLC) development at the secondary level. Additionally, we will begin supporting systemic professional development efforts focused on secondary math.
